Planting Trees and or Shrubs

If you are planting trees in your yard, consider these tips before you select your tree.

- Lot size.
- How tall will the tree grow?
- What shape will the tree be ... round, oval, etc.
- Are there any power lines close by, if so plant trees that grow over 25' tall at least 25' away from power lines.
- Trees and shrubs should be planted at least 10 feet away from pad-mounted ground transformers and fire hydrants.
- What type of root system does the tree have? Will it interfere with the foundation of you home, other buildings or sidewalks?
- DO NOT PLANT trees in utility easements.

Selecting trees or bushes appropriate for your location can minimize future problems. Also remember to "Call Before You Dig" at "811" or 1-800-424-5555.

Watering Efficiently

How much water does a lawn need? Turf grasses need about 3/4" - 1" of water per week to maintain green color and active growth. However, during certain times during the summer when high temperatures are the norm, you should allow lawns to naturally slowdown in growth during those extreme conditions. Many factors such as the soil and weather all have a role in the lawn's water needs. Here are a few guidelines to follow:

- **Water as infrequently as possible.** Thoroughly water when you do water so moisture soaks down to the roots. Exceptions to this general rule would be for newly seeded lawns.
- **Water early in the day if possible.**
- **Spread the water uniformly across the lawn.**
- **Water conservation.** To help conserve water, mow your lawn at a higher than normal height.
- **Avoid overwatering.**
- **Hold off watering after fertilization and hold off fertilizing if heavy rains are expected.**

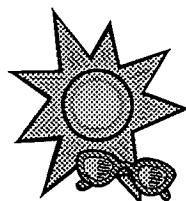
